#### March 20 – Margin Call (2011)

Set during the early hours of the 2008 financial crisis, *Margin Call* takes viewers behind the closed doors of an investment bank on the brink of collapse. Starring Kevin Spacey, this intense drama explores the moral dilemmas faced by key player as they confront the impending disaster that would reshape global markets.

## ■ March 21 *- Trading Places (1983)*

A classic comedy starring Eddie Murphy and Dan Aykroyd, *Trading Places* is a humorous yet sharp commentary on the absurdities of Wall Street's power structures. When a streetwise comman and a wealthy commodities broker swap lives, the result is a hilarious and thought-provoking exploration of social and economic inequality.
